## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### "Bubble, bubble, breathe"

Sure, it's an unusual theme for an annual report. And you may take the time to ask why.

When we teach children to swim, one of the mantras we use is these simple words. There is purpose and meaning behind them. They encourage awareness ..and a smooth calm transition between one seemingly unconnected movement and another. When we focus on the most basic pieces of a sequence it leads us to the next logical step in the path. We focus on the flow. And not the individual elements.

I see a parallel in this and what we require moving forward in the operation of our Surf Club. The cohesion and seamless flow between the various aspects of club life, from the social aspects to the education team, from lifesaving operations to the gear team. We all rely on each other. To perform our individual roles. But equally to be mindful of the connections between all the other aspects that connect. And to simplify these connections. To focus in our unified direction of keeping people safe. To move forward. Together.

We all by now are familiar with the overarching proposition for our Club "You're In Safe Hands". It is a reflection of how vital and valuable it is to learn the lessons of the past, and incorporate these lessons within the Whale Club mindset. It is also a future vision. That the members of Whale Beach will continue to instill confidence, will look to the future and will point in the direction of our unifying purpose. Of keeping people safe. Every year since we selected the "In Safe Hands" tagline we have attempted to align this enduring statement with something that we see as being seasonally relevant. We have journeyed with our themes from "Expect the Unexpected" and "Courage is Encouraged" to highlight adaptability and resilience during the pandemic, into the ever refreshing post-COVID theme "Pop up for Air ..at Whale". He is meticulous, trustworthy and diligent and has provided exceptional directional leadership ensuring that the club is future proofed and that the financial position of the club is healthier than it has ever been. Anthony Leonard, as Secretary, has supported the seamless administration of the clubs operation and without his wisdom and persistence the walls would have certainly wobbled. Anthony has provided an air of grace and leadership for the years he has supported my Presidency and I am forever grateful for his listening ear, his counsel and his hugs.

Greg, Zander, Tom, Mirek, Sami, Jayden, Gussy W, Carolina, Elliot, Zee, Harry M, Winnie and Andy and Josh D cracked over an astounding 100 hours - in fact the whole Darley family cracked 100 hours each in addition to other duties. These 19 people made up a fair chunk of our patrol hours. We simply can't continue without spreading some of this load whilst celebrating the epic dedication of these individuals.

Particular thanks need to be extended to the Education team. These legends ensure that the training and preparation of our lifesavers is of the highest order. The

nature of Whale, without a nippers programme, and a tiny catchment of residents, is that we train a number of people every year via programmes like the Knox Bronzies and accelerated school holiday programmes, but we also lose a fair portion due to the stages of life that we actually prepare people for, like going to uni and gaining full time employment. Carrying this load is a time consuming weight for even a supremely capable team like ours and sometimes these tasks need dividing to conquer. Education team leader Sophie Wines performed a terrific job kicking off the season leading courses and proficiencies as Chief Training officer and as she focused on her studies mid-season, the team of Saskia and Olivia and Jac and Cam and Maddie stepped up and brought the training season home with a bang. I thank the whole team for their dedication to this noble cause.

A spotlight of thanks behind the scenes also needs to be extended to our Member Protection Officers. The MPIOs are in a truly tricky role, carrying emotional weight as the wise mums and dads of the club. ## **TREASURER'S** REPORT

## STATEMENT **BY MEMBERS** OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Season 2023/24 commenced in the shadow of a difficult and disappointing AGM. Engagement was low and frustrations were high. However, in true Whaley fashion, once the flags went up, the grandstanding evident at the AGM was guickly put in the rear-vision mirror, and focus returned to our core purpose of saving lives as the dedicated group of heroes that patrol Whale Beach went about doing what we love, with the people we love in a location we love. A heartfelt thank you to all who served on our sand this season.

Financially, season 2023/24 was another With respect to the year ahead, very good year. Our full year income was ~\$850K with primary sources being Food, Beverage & Merchandise (Deck Café) (\$513K), surf club functions (\$110K), donations (\$82K), membership subscriptions (\$79K), sponsorships (\$37K) and grants & subsidies (\$29K). Full year expenses totalled ~\$826K with major expense categories being Food, Beverage & Merchandise (\$450K), surf club functions (\$130K), repairs and maintenance (\$93K), administration (\$54K), donations to Property Club (\$52K) and depreciation (\$47K).

With the support of SLSA's Beach Safety Equipment Fund, augmented with profits from our beloved Deck Cafe, this season we replaced our ageing fleet of Bennett Rescue Boards, purchased a third Zodiac IRB and two additional Mercury motors, paid the deposit for a Thundercat IRB (due 2025), replaced all IRB fuel cells, purchased a fuel storage cabinet and installed defibrillators on the clubhouse - underpinning our operational capability for the decade ahead. Thanks to generous donations from Erica Mann, Gary Zamel & Martin Armstrong, we also took delivery of our new surf boat - the 'Bill Phillips' - and returned WBSLSC to competition rowing with two teams - the Moby Dicks and Moby Chicks. Finally, as the season closed, we invested in a fleet of Kracka Racing Boards and additional gym equipment in support of the committed group of young members seeking to return WBSLSC to competition ranks at branch, state and national carnivals. While they continue to train and represent WBSLSC, Beach Property Surf Life Saving Club. they do so with the full support and gratitude of the club behind them.

The greatest challenge for any surf club is recruiting and retaining members to patrol. To reduce barriers to volunteering, and to acknowledge participation, this season we (i) waived membership fees for returning members (with >50 hours service in 2022/23) reducing member costs by ~\$6K, and (ii) funded meals for patrols reducing member out of pocket expenses by ~\$15K. We were delighted by how well these initiatives were received and are pleased to confirm that they will be fully funded again in season 2024/25.

management has recently learned that multiple conditions of the 1995 Development Application for the renovation of our clubhouse at 227 Whale Beach Road were not adequately addressed at that time. Consequently, Northern Beaches Council has queried the compliance of the Moby's tenancy & the Deck Cafe and cast some uncertainty over their ongoing capacity to provide fundraising income streams for our charities. At the time of writing this annual report, the Officers of the associations have commissioned an urban planner to advise management on licensing and compliance requirements in the hope of confirming council's approval to continue cafe operations in their current form.

Finally, as Treasurer, I cannot overstate the impact of donations, subscriptions and grants on club finances. My sincerest thanks to all members, friends and private donors who support the club in this manner, increasing donations by 60% YoY (to \$82K) and subscriptions by 43% YoY (to \$79K). Sincere thanks also to Macquarie Bank for their generous sponsorship of our 50th anniversary Big Swim, to SLSS for their support of the Club Lifesaving Equipment Grant and to SLSNSW for their support of the Compliance Grant received as acknowledgement of our exemplary governance standards. It is with great pleasure that I submit this year's audited financial statements and report a final net profit of \$23K after making a \$52K donation to the Whale

Whale Beach SLSC Incorporated (the Club) is incorporated as an Association under the Associations Incorporation Act 1984 (NSW). We are covered by SLSNSW Charitable Fundraising Number 11033.

Our full Financial Report includes our comprehensive compliance statements and the independent audit report from our Auditor, Kevin Veale of Morgan Veale & Co.

The Club's Management Committee takes responsibility for the financial statements included in this Annual Report and declares that the Club meets its obligations under the Acts and Standards under which we operate and that the summary financial statements included in this Annual Report are an accurate extract from our full Financial Report. There are reasonable grounds to believe the Club will be able to pay its debts as and when they become due.

The 50th Palm Beach to Whale Beach Swim is a milestone in our club's history.

Going back to 1974 and the 48 who followed Club Captain Bob Lynch's challenge, to now, for half a century club members have organised one of this country's premier community sporting events.

Whale Beach SLSC laid the foundations of the sport of ocean swimming. Resulting in an unrivaled growth rate as many other surf life saving clubs followed. A proud achievement .

On January 28 this year it was a privilege to welcome 3 of the 48 members who swam in 1974.

The saying "history has a habit of repeating", was found true this year on January 28. In 1974 48 members lined up at Palm Beach for the inaugural swim. The day was cloudy and a strong south easterly wind blowing as we set off. Rounding the south point at Palm Beach we were met by a strong southerly chop and current which convinced some members to declare at the Whale Beach finish to Bob, "that's two swims, my first and my last."

There were 1405 swimmers in the 2.7k swim this year.

On turning south at the Palm Beach point swimmers were greeted with that same strong south easterly in the face and a strong current experienced in 1974. Resulting in slower times for most swimmers. in the 2.7k swim.

There were 242 entrants in the 1k Little Big Swim (LBS). Sponsored by McGrath Real Estate Avalon Beach. Conditions for the LBS were perfect for the first-timers introduction to ocean swimming.

We also underwent 78 Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) and 55 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) proficiencies, to make Whale Beach as safe as can be!

This season, we welcomed 37 new Bronze members and 10 Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) members across two accelerated courses and from Knox Grammar School's SLS program. We welcome new members with open arms, and each new member brings a new perspective to an already diverse surf club. A whole host of members continued along the education path, with many gaining at least two additional awards this season. Special mention to Aaron

Chant, who gained his Bronze in October 2023 and has since done an additional three awards and is training for his IRB Drivers currently.

This season has also seen a their First Aid and 17 gaining their ART! In addition, IRB introduced 6 new drivers and 4 new crew this season! Special thanks goes to Lindsay Kershaw for organising the IRB courses and continuing to go the extra mile to ensure our boat operators are at their best! Our club was also very excited to be the location of the Australian Lifesaving Boat Emergency Rescue Training (ALBERT) course in May, resulting in 8 of our IRB operators undertaking training to develop their on-water skills even further.

## GEAR AND EQUIPMENT REPORT

The 2023/24 season was an exciting one for the Whale Beach SLSC Gear Team, with our focus being centred on continuous improvement and streamlining the storage & organisation in our boat sheds.

Cameron Cormio and Harry Millard have led the IRB team this season, ensuring all our motors and IRB hulls are compliant and running smoothly. With the help of Andrew Darley, we have purchased a new Zodiac Milpro IRB hull, as well as two new 25hp Mercury outboard motors. These motors are currently being run in and will be a valuable addition to our fleet for the start of the 2024/25 season. In addition to this, we have placed an order for a Thundercat IRB hull, which we should receive within the next two years.

Toby Milroy has been in charge of our boards & surf skis this year. With over 34 rescue boards, 22 race boards and 8 surf skis, this is no small task. Thanks to the Beach Safety Equipment Fund Grant, we were able to purchase 8 new Bennett Soft Rescue Boards. We have also purchased 7 new race boards from Bennett, and 7 from Kracka. These have already been put to use in furthering Whale Beach SLSC's competition capability at both branch and state championships.

Olivia Rees-Ewen and Sophie Wood have been our First Aid Officers, and have ensured that the first aid room, first aid kits, oxygen resuscitation kits and defibrillators have been kept stocked and clean.

We have worked with Northern Beaches Council this season to increase publicly accessible rescue equipment at Whale Beach. In addition to the existing rescue tubes at 3 locations, we now have a rescue board permanently positioned towards the northern end of the beach, and hope to soon have one at the southern end as well. We have also installed a publicly accessible defibrillator out the front of the surf club.

With the 2023/24 season over, we now turn our focus to the 2024/25 season. I would like to extend a massive thank you to everyone who has contributed to helping look after Whale Beach SLSC's gear & equipment. As our website says, "running a surf club takes a village", and we couldn't do it without you.







## IRB AND POWER EQUIPMENT REPORT Cameron Cormio / Harry Millard IRB and Power Equipment Captains

This season has been a massive learning curve for Harry and myself filling our new roles as IRB Co-Captains at Whaley. Over this season we have purchased two new engines and one new hull to replace old equipment and ensure prompt rescue times in the event of an emergency. IRB Education has been successful with two combined crew and driver courses being held this season. We would like to thank the IRB trainers Lindsay Kershaw, Greg Hannaford and Harry Millard for the time they put towards these courses. These swims are a great way to learn new skills, navigate unfamiliar surf and for clubs to work together within surf lifesaving.






























## VALE

Two lives were clawed back from the sea that day. Without Angus, his skills in the ocean and his vigilance, this man and his friend would simply not be around. His board rescue and the result still leaves me with a feeling that I witnessed a miracle that day. Angus typified lifesaving. A warriorfit legend of a man dedicated to doing the right thing for others, Angus was a proud Whaley for half of his life. Angus picked up the full



bag of metal, a Bronze when he ioined in 2009 as a vouth, a few Silvers in 2011 and 2016 for Beach Management and IRB Driving, and the much coveted Gold Medallion as Club Vice Captain in 2016. I share with love a picture of this amazing achievement. Angus and Floyd made Whale proud that day and every other day, as we all stood taller on their proud shoulders. It sure wasn't about the accolades for Angus though, he gave more than he demanded. We were truly blessed by his presence, his commitment to our cause, but most of all by how he did it. Whale played a meaningful part of his adventure in this journey we call life. He grew from youth to man with Whale sand under his toes. The time we spent with him was his gift to us all. On behalf of a grateful club, I thank him for this gift. The hole he leaves behind is large. And deep. We stand united in our support for the Bownes family in their time of deep and profound loss. We have a hole, but they have a gaping chasm. To Suzy and Oliver, your bro sure was one of the great men. You three have always filled my heart with so much joy and hope for the future and the quality of the next generation and the power of sibling teamwork. Long may his memory continue to make you proud. And grateful for the times you shared. To Sheree and Iain, hugs are the

only thing I can extend to you as words will never do this justice. You crafted a great man. Because you are genuinely great people. You can

truly be proud of the man Angus was and the parents that you are. To my mate, lain, "The Silver Fox". I am overwhelmed with the thought of you having one less fox cub to tend to. You really are one of my all time heroes. I thank you for all you do and for all you are. My heart breaks for you my friend. We started this Whale journey together and I thank you for every day we have spent together, for your eternal vigilance and your friendship. And

I am deeply sorry for your loss. We are a small and tight knit group and the passing of Angus hits us as a team and as part of our Whale family.
